## Spring Cleanup 2018

**First Two Weeks of June**  
Wed-Fri (8:00 am – 4:00 pm)  
Saturday (9:00 am – 4:00 pm)

Freeport residents have the **first two weeks of June (ending Saturday, June 16<sup>th</sup>)** to bring one free load of waste to the Recycling Center using the Cleanup Coupon contained in the Town mailer that residents received in May. Residents will also be required to have a 2018 facility sticker (\$6.00) which can be purchased at the Recycling Center the day of disposal or can be purchased ahead of time (at the Recycling Facility and the Town Hall). As in years past, some material will have fees associated with them, so residents are encouraged to review their flyer for the list of acceptable items and fees.

For the past few years, volunteers helped manage the influx of donations helping to keep the Swap Shop organized. Their help was invaluable! We are looking for volunteers who can work a few hours on either of the first two Saturday in June.

### US Attorney's Office Award

The Town of Freeport is proud to announce that Detective Gino Bianchini, Freeport Police Department, received the 2018 Public Service Award from the U.S. Attorney's Office in Virginia. He assisted them with an investigation of investment fraud that turned into a case of obstruction of justice. The person involved victimized various investors resulting in losses of over \$41.75 million and a tax loss to the United States of over \$200,000. Congratulations to Detective Bianchini on receiving this award and promoting a working relationship with our law enforcement partners on the national level.

### Maine Criminal Justice Academy Graduation

The Freeport Police Department is also happy to announce that Officer Steven Milton successfully passed the Maine Criminal Justice Academy with flying colors. Officer Milton is beginning his field training here in Freeport, so please say hi if you see him out and about in Town!
