Town Manager's Report
May 5th, 2015

The Maine Law Enforcement community collected 23,500 pounds of unused and unwanted drugs on Saturday, April 25th during the semi-annual drug take back day. The public input phase of trail planning work to create a management plan for the Hedgehog Mountain trail system has begun. The Town invited the public to join guided walking meetings on the trails in the Hedgehog Mountain area last Saturday, May 2nd. This event introduced the Hedgehog Mountain area trails to people, and guides provided several questions to help the walkers evaluate the trail system. About 15 people participated in the walks and came back from the guided tours with many comments and suggestions. The next step is to document those comments and suggestions, and then work with various involved groups such as the Conservation Commission and National Park Service to decide how to implement those suggestions moving forward.
